



# Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Benefits

QUARTERLY REPORT  
JULY 1 – SEPTEMBER 30, 2010

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## 1.0 Introduction

The following represents Husky Energy's (Husky's) Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Benefits Report for the quarter ending September 30, 2010, as required under the Conditions set out in Decision 2001.01 for the White Rose Development Project.

This report provides a summary of progress/activities related to Husky Energy's East Coast Operations.

## 2.0 Highlights for the Period

- Overall Canada / Newfoundland content for Husky's East Coast operations which includes the White Rose Project, North Amethyst Project, West Pilot Scheme and Exploration was 64.9% NL and 19.8% Other Canadian.
- Total employment for White Rose Operations was 941 as of September 30, 2010.

## 3.0 White Rose Employment Summary

As of September 30, 2010, a total of 941 people were employed on Husky's White Rose Operations of which 360 were located offshore. This includes people employed with Husky and its contractors. Of this total 865 or 92% were residents of Newfoundland and Labrador when hired, while another 54 or 6% were residents of other regions of Canada at the time of hire. All of these positions were located in Newfoundland and Labrador as at September 30, 2010. The number of females employed on White Rose operations was 153 or approximately 16% of the total workforce.

## 4.0 North Amethyst Tieback Project

North Amethyst development drilling related to the project continued in the third quarter of 2010. During this period, one production well was completed. A water injection well was spudded and is currently nearing completion. A total of 226 people were employed on the project as of the end of September 2010. Person hours for the period totaled approximately 146,851 bringing the total to date to over 1.95 million. The majority of expenditure for North Amethyst in this quarter is related to development drilling.

## 5.0 West White Rose Pilot Scheme

A total of 219 people were employed on the project as of the end of September 2010. Person hours for the period totaled approximately 106,508. Previous employment data for the West White Rose Pilot Scheme were included in the White Rose project data prior to this reporting period.
