QUARTERLY REPORT APRIL 1 – JUNE 30, 2012

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1.0 Introduction

The following represents Husky Energy's (Husky's) Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Benefits Report for the quarter ending June 30, 2012, as required under the Conditions set out in Decision 2001.01 for the White Rose Development Project.

This report provides a summary of progress/activities related to Husky Energy's Atlantic Region and includes activities of its major sub-contractors as well.

2.0 Highlights for the Period

 Overall Canada / Newfoundland content for Husky's operations which includes the White Rose Project, North Amethyst Project, West Pilot Scheme and Exploration was content breakdown of 58.66% Newfoundland & Labrador, 20.83% Other Canadian, and 20.51% Foreign.

3.0 White Rose Employment Summary

As of June 30, 2012, a total of 983 people were reported employed on Husky's White Rose Operations of which 442 were located offshore. This includes people employed with Husky and its contractors. Of this total 883 or 90% were residents of Newfoundland and Labrador when hired, while another 68 or 7% were residents of other regions of Canada at the time of hire. All of these positions were located in Newfoundland and Labrador as of June 30, 2012. The number of females employed on White Rose operations was 181 or approximately 18% of the total workforce (Table 3.1).

4.0 North Amethyst Tieback Project

Activity on the North Amethyst project was limited in the second quarter of 2012 due to the fact that there was no drilling of development wells during the quarter. Person hours for the period totaled approximately 410 (Table 4.1). These hours represent onshore work related to planning for continued future development wells in North Amethyst. There is no headcount for this period because the headcount is recorded at the end of the quarter and there was no activity recorded for North Amethyst in the month of June. The person hours identified for the quarter were recorded in April and May.

5.0 West White Rose Pilot Scheme

Drilling and completion of the West Pilot Scheme water injection well was completed early in Q2. A total of 28 people were employed on the project as of the end of June 30, 2012 (Table 5.1).

Note that no offshore person hours are identified in Table 5.1. This is because the Pilot Scheme water injection well was completed in April 2012 and the headcount hours are posted for the last month of the quarter. In June there was no activity offshore related to the West White Rose Pilot Scheme.

The Exploration spend for the second quarter of 2012 was approximately \$2.5 million, with a content breakdown of 59.07% Newfoundland & Labrador, 40.90% Other Canadian, and 0.02% Foreign. This activity is attributed to various subsurface studies and ongoing work in support of identifying future drilling targets.
