# Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Benefits

QUARTERLY REPORT JANUARY 1 – MARCH 31, 2015

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#### 1.0 Introduction

The following represents Husky Energy's (Husky's) Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Benefits Report for the quarter ending March 31, 2015, as required under the Conditions set out in Decision 2001.01 for the White Rose Development Project.

This report provides a summary of progress/activities related to Husky Energy's Atlantic Region and includes activities of its major sub-contractors as well.

#### 2.0 White Rose Project Employment Summary

In Q1 2015, a total of 1935 people were reported employed on Husky's White Rose Operations of which 790 were located offshore. The total employment number includes people employed with Husky and its contractors and includes North Amethyst and South White Rose Extension (SWRX). The offshore number for this reporting period includes personnel from two drilling rigs (*Henry Goodrich* and *GSF Grand Banks*) and the *SeaRose FPSO*. The overall increase in personnel for Q1 2015 reflects the period when Husky was operating both the Henry Goodrich and the GSF Grand Banks (see Transocean in Table 2.2) as well as increased marine activities related to ice management (see Atlantic Towing and Maersk in Table 2.2).

Of this total, 1742 or 90% were residents of Newfoundland and Labrador when hired, while another 140 or 7% were residents of other regions of Canada at the time of hire. The number of females employed on White Rose operations was 286 or approximately 15% of the total workforce (Table 2.1).

#### 3.0 White Rose Extension Project Employment Summary

In December 2014 Husky notified stakeholders that it was deferring the final investment decision on West White Rose in order to identify further cost efficiencies with the proposed WHP and to review alternate development concepts including subsea.

As of March 31, 2015, 347 people were reported employed on Husky's White Rose Extension Project, representing over 130,000 person hours. The decline in employment for this period is the result of project deferral and the subsequent winding down of some activities. The number of females employed on the project was 81 or approximately 23 percent of the total workforce.

The majority of person hours expended on the project for this quarter were by Dexter Construction related to completion of the graving dock at Argentia as well as continued CGS engineering design work by Arup Canada and the wrap up period of topsides engineering design work by Wood Group/Mustang. Husky hours are related to project management and engineering design support.

Eighty-three percent of the person hours related to detailed engineering of the CGS took place in Newfoundland and Labrador in this quarter (see Arup in Table 3.1) and, overall, 80 percent of person hours expended on the project occurred in Newfoundland and Labrador.

It should be noted that while Table 3.2 indicates a high number of individuals working on the engineering of the CGS internationally, the majority of the person hours expended are being done by the personnel situated in Newfoundland and Labrador (Table 3.1). The head count shown in Table 3.2 is a snap shot of personnel who have charged hours to the project on March 31 and does not necessarily represent full time employees.

The majority of positions in Q1 2015 were associated with engineering supported by administration, management, other professionals and technicians/technologists (Table 3.3).

The Exploration spend for the <u>first quarter of 2015</u> was approximately \$73.40 million, with a content breakdown of 94.6 percent Newfoundland & Labrador, 5.16 percent Other Canadian, and 0.24 percent Foreign. This equates to expenditures totaling approximately \$69.43 million, Newfoundland & Labrador, \$3.79 million Other Canadian, and \$176,000 Foreign
