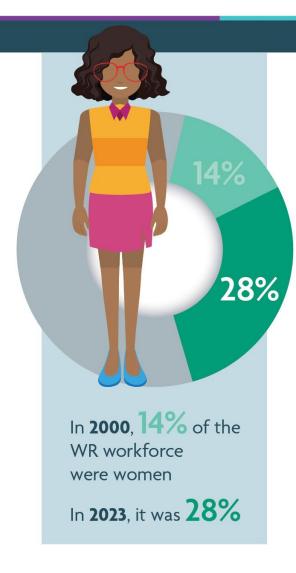
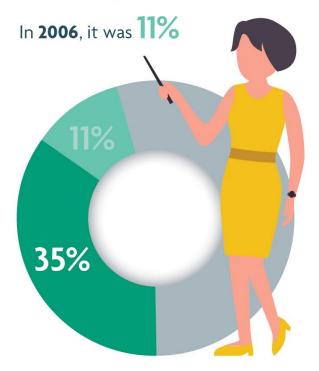
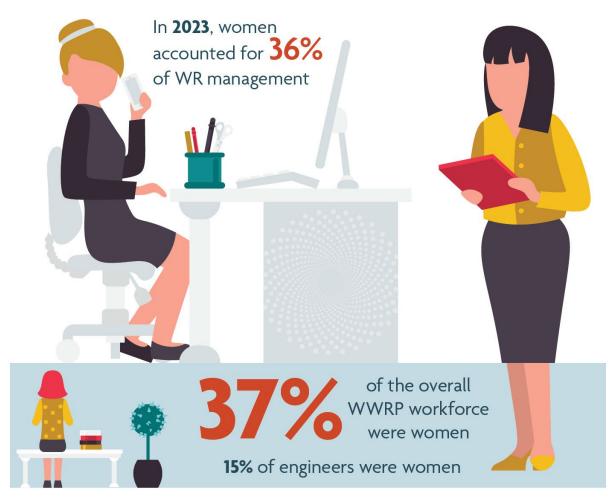

In **2023**, **35%** of engineers on the WR workforce were women

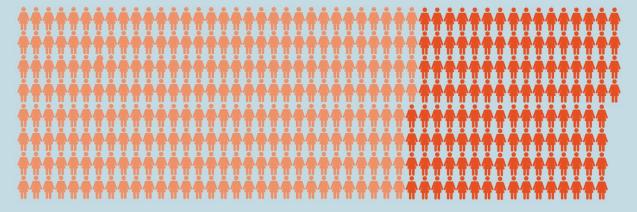

Across the two projects, women made up 15% of the total workforce.

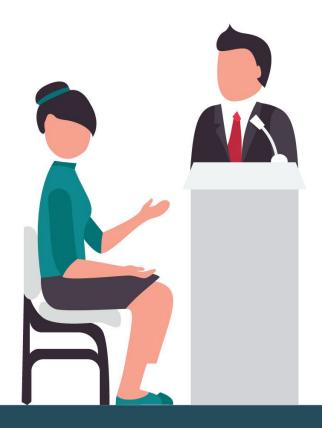


However, only 3% of offshore positions.
